Dear High Point Community:

Today, the Sussex County Department of Health has confirmed two COVID-19 positive cases within our school community.

The administration has conducted contact tracing and all necessary and appropriate protocols and DOH guidelines for both cases. In every instance we notify anyone who has been deemed to have been in close contact; we direct those individuals to quarantine as appropriate. Neither case will impact scheduled activities or on-site learning.

High Point appreciates the timely and exhaustive efforts from our local Department of Health, who offers this important reminder:

The symptoms of COVID-19 are similar to the regular seasonal influenza and include fever, coughing, and shortness of breath. Some have reported additional symptoms, such as a runny nose, sore throat, nausea, lethargy, lack of appetite, vomiting, and diarrhea. Individuals who need medical care should call their medical provider to report their illness prior to seeking care at a clinic, physician's office, or hospital. Parents of students exhibiting flu-like symptoms or staff members exhibiting flu-like symptoms are asked to contact a school nurse, local health authorities or the Sussex Department of Health.

We are continuing to monitor this situation and will provide you with updates as appropriate.
