- Testing requirements

### **504 PLANS & IEPS**

Disclosing to a college about having a 504 Plan and an IEP in high school is voluntary. However, if you would like to receive services, you would be required to disclose that information. You can reach out to each school to view the types of services and requirements for their program.

Here are a few examples: <u>Centenary University</u> <u>Lock Haven University</u> <u>Rowan University</u> <u>SCCC</u>



In college, a student must self-disclose and self-advocate to receive approved services. College staff are not allowed to speak to professors for them.



# **COLLEGE VISITS**

How to "Visit" College Campuses in a COVID World

Visiting a college, whether it is a drive around campus, an in-person tour, or through virtual information sessions is a key component of the overall process.

- Individual Visits Some colleges are now open for small individual or group tours. \*\*Available apps for self-guided tours.
- Virtual Events Take advantage of these! Colleges offer more than just a virtual tour and information sessions highlighting the admissions process.
- Take advantage of college admissions representative <u>appointments</u> in Naviance.
- If you are able, even if a college is closed to visits, you may still be able to drive around the campus to obtain a visual of what it looks like. Do this when possible.



### **TESTING**

### SAT / ACT

**\*\*Update on the SAT - College Board eliminated the Essay and Subject Tests**\*\*

- What's the difference? Should I take both?
- What are they? Should I take both?
- What is "super scoring" and how does it work?
- Fee waivers are available to students eligible for free or reduced lunch. Ask your counselor.

### TESTING

#### **GET ORGANIZED FOR COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TESTING**

- This Google Doc has been shared with all juniors
  - Dates/deadlines/advice and planning

Score reports are sent directly to colleges from <u>CollegeBoard</u> and <u>ACT</u>.

- 4 score reports are free, if requested at registration
- Request your score reports EARLY as delivery is *not* instantaneous



## **TEST OPTIONAL**



#### WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

- Colleges do not require the SAT / ACT when reviewing applications for admission. But, look a bit further:
  - Does your specific major require testing?
  - If you apply test optional, does the college require a placement test?
  - Do you need test scores to qualify for specific scholarships?

#### WHAT SHOULD I DO?

We recommend taking the
 SAT/ACT at least once. As you
 select and review the
 admission requirements for the
 colleges, talk with admissions
 officials and your Guidance
 Counselor on the next steps to
 take.




### NAVIANCE


