Mr. Stumpf opened the meeting with the flag salute and the reading of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act Statement:

The motion unanimously carried with a voice vote.

VI PUBLIC COMMENTS - AGENDA ITEMS ONLY

Brian McGuinness, High Point Student, Grade 12 - asking what voice the students at High Point have in the decisions that are made. He spoke on the impact that Coach Delaney has had on the students at High Point.

PJ Mindo, High Point Student and member of the football team, read an e-mail from a former student, Matt Heyman, regarding Coach Delaney and the impact that he had on him.

Connor Staudinger read a prepared statement about the "injustices at High Point" and felt that the Board is not just in their actions to save money.

Eric Caldwell, parent, had five students who attended High Point, and stated he did not care if his taxes went up \$5,000, but he just hates that these students will be losing their friend and coach. "I am upset, along with the community. This is our family and we need to protect our family."

Kyle Schmitz, High Point Student and member of the swim team, spoke in support of Mr. Carlson, "They are more than teachers, they are our friends, coaches and mentors."

Ron Anello, Lafayette resident, parent, and educator, spoke on behalf of Coach Delaney, "I don't want to see our coaches lose their jobs. Coaches are more to our students. Coach Delaney has provided consistency to the football program. He is like a father to his team. Find a way, please, find a way."

Antionette Fasino, High Point Student, spoke of the budget process. "If we cut teachers, we lose humans. We need to work together, communication is a key, we want to help in the decisions."

Amanda Autore, High Point Student, stated that she wanted to celebrate the great accomplishments of the High Point teachers. She is not here to fight for one staff member. Our teachers care about learning and our lives outside of school.

Paul Derin, Wantage resident and former employee, stated, "This is about the future of High Point and propaganda. 'This ship is sinking' and the band is still playing." The Board members are coming to the meetings without any information being shared. He spoke of poor management and began political comments. He was called to order by Mr. Stumpf.

Theresa LaFranco, resident and parent, spoke on behalf of Coach Delaney and hoped that other cuts could be made and the Coach's position could be saved. Please look elsewhere for cuts.'

Kyle Rutledge, High Point Student, stated "Our coaches don't give up on the students, please don't give up on them."

Dan Muller, teacher, "I regret moving here, this is a job not a passion." Last year the Administration asked the teachers to give back 1.5%, but, gave the Administrators a 3.7% increase. At today's meeting the teachers were again asked for give-backs, Administrators are not giving anything more again this year. He believes that the courses cut were vindictive.

Mr. Nelson, noted he would like more time to look into the classes that are being cut.

Mr. Case, asked if there was an analysis done.

Maria Kucinski, parent, spoke on behalf of Coach Delaney and Coach Russell, and asked not to make rash decisions and sell our soul.

Paul Pfile, resident and Sussex County Wrestling Recreation Team leader, spoke on behalf of Coach Delaney. High Point successes trickle down and have an impact on the youth leagues.

Joe Theese, student and lacrosse player, spoke on behalf of Coach Russell.

Katie Kohle, student, spoke on behalf of Coach Delaney, saying the Board doesn't realize the mistakes that you are making, but, you will not take a pay cut.

Frankie Crampton, graduate, stated the Board is not cutting jobs they are cutting careers. He also spoke on behalf of Coach Delaney. Don't take the easy way out.

Kevin Pettenger, student and football player, spoke on behalf of Coach Delaney, "our tax dollars pay the teachers' salaries".

Cathy Compa, Wantage resident, spoke on behalf of teachers. People in this town have no respect for teachers, they will not pass this budget. Does not understand why Superintendents and union never seem to get along. We need to work together.

Thomas Morville, parent, spoke on behalf of the swim team, Coach Russell, Carlson, and Mr. Costello. He thanked the Board for allowing the students to be heard. Please re-think these decisions.

Tim Noon, student, spoke on behalf of Coach Russell, Coach Emma and Coach Carlson. Please re-think.

Joe Drossel, resident, asked if every avenue has been explored. Jim Delaney is the captain of the ship.

Lauren Millahn, student, what is it going to take for the administration and teachers to work together. Why are our voices not heard.

Pam Flynn, resident of Sussex Borough, spoke in support of Coach Delaney, There must be other ways. Have we looked into shared services; child study team, maintenance, etc.?

Bill Park, Wantage resident and parent, spoke on behalf of Coach Delaney, saying these kids want a good education, "you all look dumb founded as if this is the first time you are hearing this".

Tammy Mindo, parent and resident, "Why does this school need a Superintendent, Principal, and two Vice Principals to run? What will the Administration give up?"

Karen Dispenzere, resident, when is the budget due to the County Office? Do you plan to submit this budget as it is?

Linda Alvarez responded the budget is due no later than March 4 to the County Executive Superintendent.

Mr. Stumpf, responded that the budget can be revised up until it is voted on by the board at the public hearing.

Thom Dolan, student, how can you cut a teacher without having a conversation with him, observing his classes, and evaluating him?

Lenna Daniels, student, understands that cuts have to happen, however, the goal should be to upset the least number of people.

John Hanson, parent, has had four children pass through High Point, and one more next year. He is in the HVAC business and can see that we have not explored all savings. The energy waste he can see in just this room is enough.

Cindy Heismeyer, Frankford resident, referenced the mission statement asking is this what keeps our system strong, "She is willing to pay for textbooks, she asked that the Board find a way.

Kelly Wexwort, parent, spoke on behalf of Coach Russell, and how her son was "crying and so very upset that Coach Russell would not be his coach."

Stacy Zaremba, teacher, spoke with empathy with the students and their feeling of loss and expressed her appreciation of the Supervisors.

Shamia Gillon, student, spoke on behalf of Mr. Russell and how our teachers are there for the students.

Alexis Constantinacos, student, spoke in support of all teachers asking if we can raise funds to keep our teachers?

Taylor Smith, student, asked how many teachers will be cut before you realize that our education is being affected. There are other places to get money and she questioned the morale of our staff and how their lives are being upset.

Mitchell Welsh, student, commented that firing coaches and teachers is not such a good idea. "Why fire someone who makes a positive impact?"

Nancy VanHorn, resident and educator, suggested that the Board read the book, *All I ever needed to know I learned in Kindergarten*. We are instruments to teach our students life lessons and affect our community.

Luke Faulkner, student, spoke on behalf of Coach Carlson.

John Heismeyer, student, asked how can you cut teachers without thinking about what it will do to them?

Gene Bove, student and swim team, spoke on behalf of Coach Carlson.

Carina Pettenger, 1980 graduate, asked to reconsider our position.

Walter Stumpf closed the public comments and thanked everyone for their input.

Mr. Hoffmann thanked Mrs. Alvarez for all the analysis she has had to produce regarding this budget.

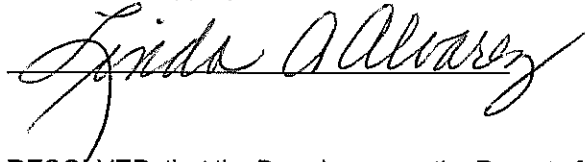

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mr. Richard Dispenzere, resident, asked why the district did not go to full 2% cap? Mr. Hoffmann responded "we want this budget to pass and thought we would have a better chance if less than 2%. We wanted to show some restraint. We really want the budget to pass. If voters don't support the budget, it will mean more cuts" Mr. Dispenzere further asked "if the Vo Tech tuition is reduced and if the budget passes, can we restore staff?" He noted he would like to see lower class sizes and more teachers kept in their position.

Ms. Denise Wilson, expressed concern about the staff being cut and not reductions in field trips, ID badges, & the student planner? She asked if there was a plan for more cuts if the budget is defeated and will be public be told before the vote is presented? Mr. Hoffmann responded, "We need people to vote. Look at the voting records and you can see who votes and who does not."

Karen Dispenziere, resident, asked for consideration to change the budget cuts based on the comments tonight and that she appreciates the work done, but does not want to cut teachers and add to administrative staff. She asked, "What is the salary for the Dean of Students and the Evaluator?" Dr. Hannum noted the Dean of Students is not an administrative position and the salaries are \$70,000 and \$90,000 respectively.

Dr. Hannum further stated that "staff cuts are never easy and this was a very emotional night. Thank you to the students and we appreciate your comments. The Board has no control over who or which teachers will stay and who will go - our hands are tied. Administrative raises were 3.5% and each administrator is giving back 1.5% of their salary toward health benefits. The HPEA increase is 3.7% with no benefits contributions. Affected staff members were spoken to by building administrators with supervisors and union reps present. Thank you to the administrative staff for handling this with professionalism and sensitivity during a very difficult process."

Pam Flynn inquired why the Senior Class trip was cancelled? Mr. Youngman responded that only 100 out of 300 students signed up. The additional days students would be out of school for the trip and the staff needed to supervise the students would be difficult to provide the trip and the educational program who those students not participating. "Other suggestions are welcome from the students for alternative events and the funds raised will offset the cost of any other events."

Ginny Craig, Wantage resident, asked about the Vo Tech tuition and asked if parents would write letters, attend meetings, and do anything they can to "rattle the cage" and bring the tuition money back to our school.

Kevin Pettenger, student, spoke on behalf of Coach Delaney. "I'm fighting for him because he would fight for me."

Mr. Hoffmann spoke about the savings to restructure the supervisors. "If supervisors were not eliminated, we would have had to eliminate 5 more teachers. We are putting great teachers back in the classroom with our students. Even after the new positions were created, we still saved 5 teachers and approximately \$270,000."

Mark Musilli asked what was the cost of the energy audit? Mr. Rowan responded the audit of not for free, but will be paid out of savings of the energy conservation measures implement. "This is a win-win situation." Mr. Mark Musilli asked if will the savings go back to the budget. Mrs. Alvarez responded, yes, we have many energy savings initiative already in place.

Mr. Mark Musilli, referenced previous Superintendents and their successes to pass budgets and referendums. He asked if the Board had ever thought about bringing in a mediator to resolve communication problems. "I

don't envy the difficult decisions and applaud you for the tough decisions. Communication is key and it seems to be lacking here." He further asked "why won't teachers contribute toward health benefits?"

Dr. Hannum commented, "We have started to see some movement here today and hope to develop it further. This is a two-way street and we have a tremendous staff and we won't keep them down."

Mr. Nelson discussed the board's goals and focus on public relations and the board's interest to improve.

Corina Pettenger, parent and resident, asked, "Have students ever come and spoken out like this at a Board meeting? How can we save staff.? Losing these teachers will have a devastating effect on these students."

Dr. Hannum responded, "Get out and vote. We need to educate and encourage students. There is always hope."

Voice in the audience, Will voting save the teachers? Dr. Hannum responded that we have to follow laws in creating the budget. Mr. Stumpf responded, "passing the budget will keep from having more cuts."

Lori Eckert, parent and Frankford teacher asked, "How is it that Frankford seems to be able to balance their budget without all the teacher cuts?" Dr. Hannum responded, "Perhaps Frankford had a different teacher settlement, maybe the Frankford teachers had given back to the budget. Next year Frankford staff will contribute 1.5% benefits contributions."

ADJOURNMENT

With no further action or discussion required of the High Point Regional High School Board of Education at this time, a motion was made by Mr. Hoffmann, seconded by Mr. Link, to adjourn the regular meeting at 10:52 pm. The motion unanimously carried by a voice vote.
