

## HIGH POINT HIGHLIGHTS - AN INSIDE LOOK

### STUDENT RECOGNITION:

- **High Point's National Honor Society** conducted their annual Blood Drive on April 30, 2004, with the highest turnout to date. The results were as follows: 164 donors presented, 33 deferrals, 131 donors drawn.

- Congratulations to the following students for bringing **High Point** its second consecutive win at the Milford-Matamoras Tri-State Scholastic Bowl: **Austin Randazzo, Melissa Eng-Wong, and Katrina Gersie.** This is the first time that a team has won consecutive championships since High Point's win in 1990. High Point competed against a tournament of teams from around the tri-state area and defeated Pleasant Valley by a comfortable 100 point margin.

- On Wednesday, April 29<sup>th</sup>, twenty-six members of **Heather Strout's** Creative Writing and Creative Writing Workshop classes hosted **Lynn Panico's** fourth grade class (from the Wantage School) for an afternoon of nature poetry. Students composed and illustrated pieces of original poetry based on their surroundings.

### ATHLETICS:

- **Chris Kappelmier** and **High Point's Varsity Baseball Team** are ranked 4th in the North I Group 3 State Tournament. On May 17, the team will play Garfield at **High Point**. On May 18, the team will go against Walkkill Valley, which could be the deciding game for winning the league.
- **High Point's Girls' Track Team** has a great record so far this season with 7 wins and 1 loss.

### PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

- On Thursday, April 29<sup>th</sup>, **Bill Bauer**, Supervisor of English, attended a workshop sponsored by The Princeton Review entitled Take a Bite Out of The New Jersey PSAT and SAT. Representatives from The Princeton Review provided a comprehensive overview of the significant changes to both the PSAT and the SAT.
- During the May **Inservice** day, teachers in the **Mathematics** and **Science** departments, and science and math teachers in the **Special Education** department participated in a workshop on Cooperative Learning, facilitated by Hector Lopez from Rutgers University. Mr. Lopez has had extensive experience in the utilization of cooperative learning in the high school classroom. By participating in a series of activities, with Mr. Lopez modeling the teacher's role in the classroom, teachers were shown methods for successfully implementing cooperative learning in the classroom.
- **Linda Abrams** and **Dorothy Sasaki** recently attended the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics national convention in Philadelphia. They attended several workshops on integrating the graphing calculator into the curriculum and training in the use of the new TI-84+ graphing calculator. They took advantage of a free "trade in" opportunity provided by Texas Instruments to exchange the department TI-83 overhead calculators for the new TI-84+. They also visited Strath Haven High School to observe classes using the Interactive Mathematics Program (IMP). **High Point** has just begun the IMP program as an alternative academic math sequence. Strath Haven High School has enthusiastically adopted that program for all students. This forum provided a sound opportunity to share concerns and discuss teaching strategies.

### STAFF RECOGNITION:

- **High Point Regional High School**, in cooperation with the **Wantage** and **Sussex Fire Departments** and **First-Aid Squads**, **New Jersey State Police**, **Sussex County Sheriff's Department**, **Saint Claire's Mobile Intensive Care Unit**, and **North STAR Airmedical Program**, conducted a mock accident on May 4, 2004. The event was staged to show students the consequences of drinking and driving. Other contributors to the event were **MADD**, **Sussex-Wantage Municipal Alliance**, and numerous **HPRHS** staff and student volunteers who acted as participants.
- **Brian Drelick** was awarded the **New Jersey High School Technology Education Teacher Excellence Award** by the Technology Educators Association of NJ at their state conference on May 6, 2004.
- **Heather Strout** received a full scholarship to attend a week-long creative writing workshop in July at the Fine Arts Work Center in Provincetown, Massachusetts. The scholarship, offered by the Geraldine R. Dodge Foundation, was given to twenty teachers throughout the state of New Jersey.
