Dress Code

5511 DRESS CODE

DRESS

A student's manner of dress is a reflection of individual taste; a matter to be determined, in large measure, by the student and their family. It is expected that High Point students' daily attire choices are appropriate to and reflective of an educational environment. Students in violation of the dress code may be required to wear a school issued T-Shirt in place of otherwise inappropriate clothing. At the end of the day, students shall return the school issued shirt. Student

Guidelines

- Footwear must be worn at all times.
- No clothing designed to be sleepwear is permitted, unless students are participating in an advertised theme day such as School Spirit Week.
- Garments designed to be worn as undergarments may not be worn as outerwear.
- Muscle shirts, except basketball jerseys, which must be worn with an undershirt; male half-shirts; sports bras worn as tops, tube tops, sheer tops, and tops that do not sufficiently cover a female student's midsection above the bottom of the ribs, are not permitted.
- Headgear, hats or hoodies are not permitted to be worn in the building during school hours. However, the Board grants the administration the discretion to lift this prohibition as deemed appropriate.
- T-Shirts or other attire, with obscene, insulting or derogatory slogans or that advertise or promote alcohol, tobacco, drugs, or sexual content are not permitted.
- All pants should be worn appropriately so that undergarments are not visible.
- No gang related or identifying garments or accessories are permitted.
- Any clothing accessory that is reflective of violence, weapons or so themed is not permitted.

- Students who come to school wearing clothes that are determined to be offensive and/or in conflict with the guidelines set forth will be given an opportunity to change or to call home for replacement clothing.
